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NICE DAY TO GO TO THE PUB

This exhibition is a series of drawings of iconic pubs and music venues in the City of Yarra. The show takes its title from a Cosmic Psychos song, a cult Australian punk band, who have un-graced the stage at The Tote Hotel (and around the world) over the past few decades.

Inspired by the raucous rock'n'roll belted out to the audience inside these venues, O'Carrigan energetically renders his love for these buildings in ink and watercolour as memorials to past raucous evenings of foot stomping, beer drinking, and all round good times.

The drawings are also aesthetic and historic documents of these buildings, which have influenced and reflected the culture of particular suburbs within the City of Yarra as its built environment has evolved over the last century.

Long live rock and roll!

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Selected works within this exhibition have limited edition prints of five only – an exclusive print run for all punters. The Tote Hotel is an exception: 20% of the proceeds will be donated to PBS 106.7 FM – one of the last bastions of community radio that that Simon has supported for nearly a decade including a few graveyard broadcasts. There are 40 prints of the drawing of The Tote Hotel available.

Thank you for supporting my work by visiting the exhibition, or following along online.

Although this exhibition is far from my first rodeo, it is a very important one to me for a few reasons. So if the friend who was meant to meet you here has not yet arrived, and you don't want to talk to the stranger next to you, read on.

Firstly, it is my first solo exhibition since ditching my day-job and becoming a full time freelance illustrator in 2017. Since then I have worked on a huge variety of client work, learned more on the job than ever before, and been a part of some great projects. It is tough to find the time and money to put together a solo show when you are in the early years of starting a business. The effort has been worth it though, as the freedom open to me working on personal pieces is liberating and challenging in a different, and essential, way from working on revisions for client works. I hope you'll enjoy looking at the works as much as I enjoyed making them.

Secondly, this project came out of a long-held love of the community radio in Melbourne, and especially PBS 106.7 FM. Being an artist means that, by necessity, you spend a lot of time in a studio by yourself. It also sometimes means sacrifices: missing that gig at The Tote because you have an urgent deadline, or because you had a slow month financially. Community radio solves both of these problems for me: you have studio companions who help you keep your routines but who you can turn down when you need to focus. You have dedicated volunteers sharing their record collections and explaining the

historical context of the music they play for you, expanding your boundaries when your own collection has been played to death. I've long supported PBS, financially when I am able, and by volunteering too: as receptionist, radio festival phone operator, even doing the announcer course and broadcasting some of my own records overnight on the graveyard shift. In 2017, I made a drawing of the Tote to sell prints of, to raise funds to donate. It was well received, and I loved working on it, and so that grew into this exhibition. It's been one long labour of love, and it's all been worth it.

Finally, as a resident of The City of Yarra for over a decade, I have spent a lot of time in the venues I have drawn, and far more time being in the presence of the varied architecture on the street. When I first moved here, I felt that there was history baked into every building (maybe it's the brutal summer sun in Melbourne that does the baking...) in a way I had not felt a connection to in any of my former hometowns. Now, as I go to these venues, I can recall an infinite series of life-changing events that were celebrated, commiserated, or took place in these buildings. These venues have, in some cases over far more than a century, helped provide a sense of community that is so important for those living in the inner city, and I hope they can be around to provide that for future generations for centuries to come.

I'd like to thank a number of people for helping with this show. Shini, at Off The Kerb, for letting me pitch, develop and ultimately exhibit such a ridiculously self indulgent concept for a show. Louisa, Emily and Karra from the City of Yarra who were my contact points in arranging the arts funding that was so helpful in ensuring the presentation of these works is up to scratch. Rhonda, Sheridan, Grace, Kit and the whole team at

Frames Readymade for belting out custom frames in record time and doing so with a smile. Ali, my long-time collaborator, coconspirator, champion and critic for all the support that ensured I could make the best work possible right now. And you, for supporting my work.

Now, go ask that stranger next to you what their favourite memory of their venue is.
